Aims and Objectives

Part 1 – 06.11.13 – Treatment planning for paediatric patients

Description:

This session will be an interactive session with small group work treatment planning some real life cases. Speaker - Miss Anjali Kandiah

Aims:

- To give tips on treatment planning for children for dentists working both in the Salaried and General Dental Service
- To discuss treatment planning for patients requiring treatment under Local Anaesthesia (with/without sedation) and General Anaesthesia

Objectives:

By the end of the course delegates will:

- Have gained a better understanding of treatment planning for patients in the primary care including the role of prevention, different restorative approaches and tips on local anaesthesia
- Understand treatment planning for patients being referred for extractions under general anaesthetic
- Be able to plan care in order to improve the outcomes for their child dental patients

Part 2 – 20.11.13 – Management of the medically compromised child

Description:

This session will be an interactive session with realistic scenarios that may present to you in the dental surgery. Speaker - Dr Siobhan Barry

Aims:

- To discuss the paediatric dental care of children with commonly seen medical conditions who may present to general dental practice.

Objectives:

- Have a greater understanding of common medical conditions in the paediatric patient
- Be able to identify the appropriate patient to manage in a primary care setting
- Be able to identify specific paediatric dental management concerns associated with common medical conditions

Part 3 – 04.12.13 – Paediatric dental traumatology

Description:

This seminar will focus on dental trauma, using case scenarios for delegates to practice treatment planning. Advanced dental trauma management techniques and when to refer will also be covered. Speaker - Miss Frankie Soldani

- Practice treatment planning for different trauma scenarios that may present to you in practice
- To discuss complex trauma scenarios, treatment options and when to refer
- Increase awareness of advanced techniques available in secondary care for the management poor prognosis permanent incisors
