

Covid 19 Standard Operating Procedure for Faculty and Trainees

Medical Education Leeds

Due to the current Covid 19 Pandemic Medical Education Leeds has had to review its operational procedures for use of educational teaching space. This is to reduce the risk as much a reasonably practicable to prevent the spread of Covid 19 as set out by current government guidance - to ensure a safe educational environment is maintained for faculty, trainees and medical education staff utilising this space.

This is a guide, not a Trust policy, to assist in the planning and delivery of training and education within LTHT during the Covid-19 pandemic. National government guidelines are required to be followed, which are updated regularly. Latest guidance is available here https://www.gov.uk/coronavirus

Defining essential face-to-face educational delivery

- There is no formal guidance on defining essential training and educational delivery requirements and common sense should be applied.
- It needs to be considered whether your educational delivery is deemed essential to be delivered face-to-face and if not can it be delivered remotely via video calling software or virtual classrooms, Medical Education can offer expert advice and support with this.
- If it cannot be delivered remotely, and face to face training is required education and clinical skills training will need to be delivered adhering to the latest government social distancing advice to maintain staff safety.

We therefore ask all faculty and trainees to agree to and respect the social distancing and further guidance set out below while using Medical Education Leeds training and education facilities.

- Lateral Flow Tests must be done each morning of event (and each subsequent morning if more than one day event) and uploaded to the lateral flow NHS site https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19result (specific website for uploading lateral flow tests) and shown to staff on entry
- If for any reason you are unable to provide a lateral flow result, you
 will not be able to attend the day and must arrange to undertake
 training at a later date/alternative method.

- To always adhere to the 2m social distancing rule at all times whilst in a Medical Education Leeds training area.
 - Unless you are wearing full personnel protective equipment (PEE) apron, glove, face mask and eye protection for clinical skills training
- To sanitise hands on entering and leaving the building
- As in clinical practice please remain bare below the elbows
- To adhere to the Medical Education SOP regarding decontamination of Medical Education Equipment –trainees and faculty and responsible for the cleaning of kit in between each use.
- To wear a surgical face mask at all times whilst in the education settings as per Government and local trust guidance
- Ensuring good respiratory hygiene by promoting the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach
- If you are attending training after being present in a clinical environment, please ensure that you have changed into clean clothes or scrubs and clean shoes prior to entering the building or department.
- To not attend any educational or training session at a Medical Education Leeds facility if they feel unwell with corona virus symptoms as listed on the following link https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/symptoms/main-symptoms/
