Registered Dental Nurses with decontamination duties

Your progress will be monitored throughout the course and your employer will be kept up to date with your progress.

Aim of the course:

 To assess the theoretical knowledge and practical skills for the individual learner to work in the dental setting, decontaminating instruments and devices as part of their normal job role

Learning Outcomes:

- Identify the different layouts of the dental decontamination area, the flow of instruments, the resource requirements to equip the area and how best practice can be achieved
- Demonstrate the decontamination process within a dental decontamination area, including the transportation of instruments, the management of waste as well as cleaning, inspecting, sterilising, and storing instruments in line with organisational and legal requirements
- Describe and demonstrate the purpose and process for validating and maintaining dental equipment and instruments in line with manufactures guidelines, organisational and legal requirements
- Describe infectious diseases, their routes of transmission and methods of preventing cross infection
- Achieve the Level 3 Certificate in Dental Decontamination

Entry

To be eligible for the course you must:

- commit to 100% attendance on the given course dates
- be able to meet the requirements for the completion of your national occupational standards portfolio

The Award

In order to achieve the award you will have to successfully complete:

- the national occupational standards portfolio of evidence, this may include assessments in a written, oral, direct observation and/or simulation method to demonstrate your knowledge and practical skills
- a pass in the City & Guilds on line assessment to unit 305, this will assess your underpinning knowledge and understanding to the learning outcomes to the award (40 minute assessment of 25 multiple choice questions, you will be required to achieve at least 76% in this assessment to achieve a pass)

Unit 302	The layout of the dental decontamination area 3 credit value
Unit 303	Decontaminating dental instruments within the decontamination area 3 credit value
Unit 304	Validation and maintenance of dental instruments and equipment 2 credit value
Unit 305	Principles of infection control in the dental environment 5 credit value
