Who Should Attend?

The course is aimed at qualified Dental Therapists. It meets the new GDC requirements for enhanced CPD.

Aim: This course will cover tips and techniques for administration of local anaesthesia, and successful atraumatic extraction of primary teeth. The course will involve video demonstrations, hands on training on phantom head, practical assessment, and post training theoretical assessment

Learning Outcomes:

By the end of the event delegates will be able to:

- Diagnose and recognise primary teeth of poor prognosis which require extraction
- Interpret radiographs and understand when would be appropriate to refer for inhalation sedation or general anaesthesia
- Demonstrate through simulation the atraumatic removal of a primary tooth, including dose calculation and administration of local anaesthetic
- Discuss the management of complications such as root fracture and undertake practice in the use of elevators

This programme qualifies for 6.5 hours of verifiable CPD
