Programme

Keith Hayes - CQC in 2015, Are you ready for Round 2?

Keith, a qualified Dentist for 37 years, has owned mixed and private practices and is a Clinical Director (Corporate) and a compliance organisation. Keith will update delegates on the new process of CQC inspection and regulation after 1st April 2015.

Objectives: To explain clearly the changes that are being applied to better regulate dental practices and to understand how practice management should prepare to satisfy the new more experienced CQC inspector.

Learning Outcomes: Delegates will have better understanding of how to:

- Set Standards and train the team.
- Have a quality Management system
- Review compliance and the living policies to keep everything up to date
- Think like an inspector – know what he is likely to ask
- Question your team like an inspector
- Look at your practice like an inspector

Gary Cousins - Facial Deformity and Infection

Gary Cousins is a Consultant Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeon and has strong links with local practitioners. He qualified as a dentist, and subsequently as a doctor, and his commitment to teaching and training has led to honorary posts in three universities. Gary will give attendees an overview of these topics in an illustrated talk, and the opportunity to participate in discussions afterwards.

Objectives: Discuss oro-facial infections: aetiology, incidence and management and collaborative management of facial deformity.

Learning Outcomes:

- To appreciate normal facial form & understand that there are variations, some variations are part of a spectrum
- That more severe forms of facial disproportion cause significant functional, psychosocial and functional problems
- That combined orthodontic treatment and surgery is used to treat patients
- The risk/benefit equations and to understand the outcomes; morbidity and PROs

Raj Rattan MBE - Legal & Ethical and Complaints

Raj is a graduate of University College Hospital, London. He is Associate Dean in the London Deanery and has considerable experience of the NHS and the private sector. Raj will provide delegates with an update on current legal and ethical issues in general dental practice.

Objectives: To review current trends in litigation and discuss effective risk management strategies for the dental team and the GDC's ethical guidance and its impact on everyday practice.
