Description

This course covers the use of composite as a convenient material to help clinicians design improved smiles, protect teeth against tooth wear, improve the occlusion as well as to restore teeth. It will be a lecture based course with table top practice elements.

Afternoon Session

13.30 -15.00 Posterior composites and dealing with the challenges: subgingival margins, difficult contact areas, getting the occlusion correct.

15.00 -15.15 Coffee

15.15-16.30 How to upgrade composites for improved aesthetics and longevity. When to use indirect composite.

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Educational Aim:

The aim of this course is to provide a deeper understanding of the uses of composite and provide skills to use composite effectively.

Objectives:

By the end of this course participants should be able to:

1. Use composite to test a smile design
2. Use composite to make an aesthetic veneer
3. Use composite to improve the occlusion.
4. Demonstrate how to deal with subgingival margins.
5. Be able to obtain good proximal contact areas
6. Be able to get the occlusion correct quickly.
7. Be able to upgrade the initial composite to improved materials both direct and indirect.
