#### <u>Aim</u>

The aim of this course is to introduce participants to environmental sustainability in relation to dentistry, so that they will be able to identify opportunities to decarbonise their current practice.

#### **Objectives:**

- To discuss the urgent need to transform current practice in dentistry
- To describe opportunities to make dentistry more sustainable through patient and staff travel, procurement and waste management, energy use and disease prevention
- To understand how to support staff and patients to change their behaviour to be more sustainable
- To use audit tools and metrics to measure environmental impact
