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Aim:

The course aims to provide participants with the knowledge on the essentials of composite dentistry, where the common pitfalls are and how to avoid them. It will also look at the use of bulk fill composites for the posterior restorations for stress free results. And efficiencies to importantly show you the secrets to successful pricing, promoting and profitability with posterior composite dentistry.

Objectives: by the end of the course, participants will;

- You will be shown the classification, composition and performance factors of composites and how the properties of dental materials can be used to optimise composite restorations.
- Gain knowledge on light curing and how it can help or hinder you.
- Be shown the types of bonding systems used in conjunction with composite technology.
- The lecturer will show you how to get easy and reliable results using the Halo and Cutback Technique.
- You will gain practical experience in the techniques of freehand composite placements to achieve aesthetic restorations in the molar and pre-molar region and find out how a limited selection of materials can be used for most cases.
- You will be shown how you can make your restorations affordable both in time and financially for the patient and clinician and recognise the pitfalls of composite placement and be able to trouble shoot.

- 1. Have experienced placement of posterior restorations using a leading bulk fill composite in almost all presentations.
- 2. See how you can make bulk fill extremely profitable for you and your surgery
- 3. Be able to identify the common reasons for composite failures.
- 4. Have a better understanding of composite materials available
- 5. Understand your curing light and how to use it properly
- 6. Gain an understanding into total etch versus self etch systems
