COURSE AIM

The aim of this two-day interactive course is provide opportunity for you to consider the essential knowledge and skills required to design, conduct, assess and evaluate teaching and learning in medical environments. The course help to increase your confidence in delivering teaching, facilitating learning, and giving feedback in a range of situations including one-to-one, small group and larger audiences. The course is open to anyone commencing a formal or informal teaching role, from ST3 onwards, SAS doctors and consultant grades.

LEARNING, TEACHING AND ASSESSMENT STRATEGY

This course will explore key skills and knowledge that underpin effective teaching practice within the clinical environment. Learning will be conducted at HEE Deanery locations in Leeds and Sheffield.

Learning and Teaching. Participants will be supported to achieve the above outcomes in the following ways:

- Through facilitated discussions and feedback.
- Through the undertaking of a variety of guided, interactive and formative activities.
- By analysis and reflection on experience, situated and contextualised within the participants' current organisation.
- Through collaboration with peers, as required, enabled by the use of technology.
- Directed and independent study using a range of academic and organisational literature.

Assessment. Assessment will be formative throughout the course.
