Aims

Connecting with your community will energise training for GPs and registrars. The aim of this session is to demonstrate how we can put communities at the heart of GP training, improve population health through medical education and ensure postgraduate education in primary care is accountable to the society we serve

Objectives

- Understand the concepts of health inequalities, social determinants of health, social accountability in medical education and community orientation and how these apply to GP training
- Discuss the role of the GP in tackling health inequity and delivering "proportionate universalism"
- Understand the role of stigma, trauma and adverse childhood experiences in health and wellbeing and the role of the GP in addressing these, including through medical education
- Analyse the needs of your local population and explore how the education you provide is socially
 accountable and takes account of the needs of vulnerable groups
- Consider how social prescribing relates to GP training and how health and wellbeing can be coproduced
- Look at how eLearning, the arts and community assets can invigorate curriculum delivery around community orientation, health inequalities and public health"
